Discussion Topic: Issue with parents chatting and blocking area needed for pick up. How can we address without negatively impacting our community?

Suggestion that we could create a suitable area where parents could chat away from the traffic lanes.

Need sign that identifies this as a high traffic area.

Create a conversation area or "Community Corner" where we can direct parents to stand. Discussion of which areas might be suitable for sitting and chatting. Closer or farther from main school doors.

Need teachers to walk kids to front of school, especially little kids. If they go out multiple doors, creates even more congestion.

Idea of multiple seating areas, possible with shelters.

Kids left too long after school also an issue. Can deny kids the privilege of staying for extended classes, but otherwise do not have many options.

Suggestion that we encourage parents to park by the back entrance of school where there is ample parking.

In the past, did major outreach for a week or two around proper parking/drop-off/pick up procedures. Need to do publicity around how to make this easier for everyone.

Could kids stay inside and walk through (past gym) to walk to side door and not go around outside corners.

Draw up detailed plans for what we want it all to look like.

Issue with parents and valets: lack of courtesy.

Need more training for valets and more flyers, publicity around how to do things correctly.

Principal's Report: nothing to add this month

Treasurer's Report: nothing to add Communications: nothing to add Fundraising: nothing to add

Events: Skate King had 230 people – made \$120. We get \$.50 per skater. Meant to be more a community event than a

fundraiser. Agreed to change name of Math Night to avoid confusion with International Night.

School Services:

April Miller in charge of special needs and is interested in setting up a parent group. Wondered if needed PTSA approval. Group both to disseminate information and to provide support. Since she is special needs chair for PTSA, can reserve space at school for meetings.

Jennifer Malick: Wants to offer 3 hour first aid class, including CPR. Can she use Emergency Prep budget? Yes, she can. 20 people for \$320. If not room in her budget, can go to a grant application. Finished up inventory for classroom backpacks. Did release drill and learned an enormous amount from that process.

Recommend that we remind parents to keep their pick up contacts current. Need to keep process centralized because forms have to be centralized in the office – can't be done in the classrooms.

Student Enrichment: Math Challenge requesting extra money.

Discussion: Need to understand what we are spending money on. Certificates vs. trophies, for example. Request that Math Challenge team provide more detailed numbers.

eScrip report: Andria Quarry, eScrip Chair

Subscribers have been notified that they need to renew.

This year, two changes to eScrip's program have adversely affected our earnings:

- 1. Safeway has decided to discontinue contributions when supporters pay with a credit card, due to the cost the company incurs from high credit card processing fees.
- 2. We must first get subscribers' permission to renew them. We contacted those supporters for whom we had contact information, but a large number of the supporters on the list have not had a child at Audubon Elementary for years, and have chosen not to renew. (The list was outdated because supporters had been automatically renewed for years.) For others, the extra effort necessary to renew themselves may be a deterrent. Contributions from any supporters who have not renewed their status have stopped as of November 1. Should any of these contributors decide to renew later, their contributions will resume.

We will continue to run eScrip as a low-profile, "background" fundraiser for the rest of this school year and re-evaluate its effectiveness in Audubon PTSA's fundraising.
